It is the intention of this pledge to promote fair play by showing respect for all participants within the Woodstock Minor Hockey Association. All players, coaches, officials and parents are responsible for encouraging and promoting fair play by signing this pledge before being allowed to participate in hockey in the Woodstock Minor Hockey system and must continue to observe these principles of fair play.

I agree to abide by the principles of the FAIR PLAY CODE, as set forth by the Canadian Hockey Association and supported by the Woodstock Minor Hockey Association. This commitment to fair play will pave the way for teamwork better hockey and positive attitudes. Whether we win or lose, we treat each other with respect.

- Respect and adhere to all ideals, policies and rules determined by the Alliance, OHF and the Woodstock Minor Hockey Association, and your team.
- Respect the rules of the game, opponents, officials and their decisions.
- Maintain self-control at all times.
- Attend as many games and practices as reasonably possible. Be present before games and practices in a timely manner. Notify the coach ahead of time if you will be absent.
- Respect the facilities, either home or away, in which you are privileged to play.
- Exhibit a high degree of sportsmanship, teamwork and positive attitude at all times when representing your team and the league.
- Control my temper fighting will not be tolerated.
- Refrain from using foul language towards teammates, coaches, officials or opponents.
- Show respect for the decisions, judgment and authority of the officials and timekeepers.
- Show respect for the feelings and abilities of the players on the other team.
- Accept the capabilities of other players.
- Ensure that your equipment is complete, safe and in good condition.
- Accept defeat graciously.
- Love the game above the prize.

OHF POLICIES

The following policies are noted for the purpose of providing information to the members of the OHF. There may be other policies duly adopted by the Board of Directors that may not be included in this section. Clarification or interpretation of the following or inquiries on those not included should be directed to the OHF Executive Director.

OHF CODE OF CONDUCT

- The OHF is committed to providing a sport environment in which all individuals are treated with respect.
- During the course of all OHF activities, athletes, coaches, parents, directors, volunteers, staff, chaperones and others within each of the Member Partners:
 - a) Shall conduct themselves, at all times, in a fair and responsible manner and refrain from comments or behaviours that are disrespectful, offensive, abusive, racist or sexist. In particular, the OHF will not tolerate behaviour that constitutes harassment or abuse or bullying, and;
 - b) Shall avoid behaviour which brings the OHF and/or it's Member Partners, or the sport of hockey into disrepute, including but not limited to the abusive use of alcohol and/or non-medical use of drugs, and;
 - Shall not use unlawful performance enhancing drugs or methods, nor shall they engage in activity or behaviour that endangers the safety of others, and;
 - d) Shall at all times adhere to Hockey Canada, OHF and it's Member Partner's operational policies, procedures and any rules governing any competition in which they participate on behalf of the OHF and/or Member Partner.
- 3. Failure to comply with this Code of Conduct may result in disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the loss or suspension of certain or all privileges connected with the respective Member Partner and/or OHF including the opportunity to participate in OHF and it's Member Partner activities. Such discipline may include the removal or ban from an arena, games, practices and other team activities.
