Subject: POWER FAILURE / DISRUPTIONS

During the course of a season there may be times of total power failure, brown outs, or power flickers in our facilities. When situations like these occur it is most likely that our lights will fail. In instances of "brown outs" or "flickers" we may not lose all lighting but it may be substantial enough to warrant stoppage of on ice activity until full light levels have been restored.

In situations of total power failure our back up emergency lights will come on. The emergency lighting level is only great enough for patrons to find their way to a safe place. Emergency lighting is not a substitute for normal ice activity.

When brown outs or flickers occur, some lights may go out while others remain on. Because of the nature of the lights, once they go out it takes a few minutes for them to come back on. <u>During the period of light level loss</u>, all ice activities must stop.

When Lights Lose Full Power:

- Skaters on the ice should go to the player's benches, or to their dressing room, and wait for arena staff to let them know when it is okay to return.
- To indicate that it is safe to return, arena staff will sound buzzer letting everyone know is okay to resume activity.

The measures in place are for the safety of all skaters. Failure to comply with this request could result in future ice time being taken away.
